Under the direct supervision of the Mental Wellness and Prevention Team Leader, he/she is responsible for providing social intervention services to members of the community, in order to help them resolve their personal difficulties in such a way as to foster their psychosocial adaptation and development.

The challenges of the job are:

- Providing direct assistance to the clientele by evaluating their psychosocial needs and referring them to adequate resources and available assistance programs.
- Doing crisis intervention, including suicide intervention, drug and/or alcohol crisis intervention.
- Counselling such as emotional management, violence prevention, etc.
- Work with the team of interveners in the development, monitoring and if required, revision of an intervention plan.
- Meet required deadlines for reports and forms

Qualifications required:

- Degree in Social Sciences or related field.
- > Relevant experience in social intervention (3-5 years of experience).
- Capacity to intervene in emergency or crisis situations.
- Knowledge and experience in the First Nations.
- > Excellent written and oral communication skills in English, Oral communication in French.
- Written French and Mi'gmag language an asset.
- Good computer skills (Outlook, Word and Excel).
- Must have valid Medicare and driver's license.

Profile of the ideal candidate:

- > Ability to communicate well and maintain positive relations within the community and the department.
- Ability to maintain confidentiality.
- Sensitive to the cultural and social dynamics of First Nations communities.
- Great team working and interpersonal skills (openness, empathy and ability to establish contacts)

Hiring priority: Given to Gesgapegiag Mi'gmaq followed by other Mi'gmaq, other First Nation persons and members of the general public.
