Under the direct supervision of the Social Services Team Leader, the Psychosocial Educator is responsible for collaborating with the Mental Wellness and Social Services Team to serve clients needing parental skills and guidance, family conferencing and early interventions.

The challenges of the job are:

- Providing assessments in regards to mental wellness and psychosocial evaluations.
- Provide support and follow-up for parents who are awaiting the birth of their child and provide assistance once the child is born.
- Actively participate and contribute in various projects, clinical or administrative meetings and working groups in connections with their files.
- Provide support to the social services team by participating in follow-up files when requested to do so (assist in evaluations and follow-up with article 32 of the youth protection act).
- Participate in clinical meetings when required.
- Accompany clients to various appointments.
- Provide prevention and education to community members in collaboration with other programs with the department.

Qualifications required:

- College Diploma in the areas of Social Science or in any other field related to the employment.
- Bachelor's degree in social work or psychology considered an asset.
- Belonging to an order considered an asset.
- Knowledge and experience in the First Nations.
- Excellent written and oral communication skills in English, oral and written communication in French considered an asset.
- Mi'gmaq language an asset.
- Good computer skills (Outlook, Word and Excel).
- Must have valid Medicare and driver's license.
